CONVERTS

Non-Jew Must Violate Shabbat

A non-Jew is not permitted to observe <u>Shabbat</u> completely. He or she must do at least one violation. This is relevant for people who are in the process of converting to Judaism.

Minor Child Convert: Status

A minor child who has converted to Judaism is considered to be Jewish even though he or she is permitted to decline to stay Jewish once reaching 12 (for girls) or 13 (for boys) years old. He or she may handle uncooked wine once he/she has converted.

Minor Child: How To Convert

A minor child is converted to Judaism the same way as an adult: immersion into a <u>mikva</u> and, for a boy, circumcision (which must be done before immersion in a <u>mikva</u>).

NOTE A child may not be converted against the will of the child's parent or guardian.

Bet Din

A <u>bet din</u> (religious Jewish men constituting a court of Jewish law) is needed for a conversion at the <u>mikva</u> and also for a *brit mila* for the purpose of conversion.
